Did you notice an increase in your retirement check on July 31, 2023? Due to the passage of CS/SB7024, signed into law on July 1, 2023, the Health Insurance Subsidy (HIS) was increased from a maximum of \$150 to \$225 per month based on 30 years of service. In addition, this bill extends the Deferred Retirement Option Program (DROP) from 5-8 years for all classes and from 8-10 years for K-12 personnel. The (DROP) rate was also increased from 1.3% to 4%.

*SB 239 was passed in the Senate to reinstate the Cost-of-Living Adjustment (COLA) from 2011 forward, but it died in the House, so the bill DID NOT pass. The reinstatement of COLA, removed in 2011 by the Legislature, will be one of FREA's priorities in the January 2024 Legislative Session. Let's bring back (COLA) in 2024!
