How To Call Your State or National Legislators

In President Echo Heyer's column in this issue, she tells version of "Shy Person's about the new "List of Legislators" compiled by Legislative chairman Nancy Adams and her cohort Kate Alexander. You can find this on the BCREA website at http://browardrea.org.In her column on page 5, Nancy Adams mentions 2 bills which are coming before the State Legislature which opens on March 7. The purpose of having this list is to enable members and any other concerned people to make their opinions known to the legislators. In the current FREA

Bulletin, there is a longer Guide to Calling Representatives." The following is an abbreviated version of that article.

Find your Sen/Reps' numbers. Find out who they are and locate their phone numbers in the "List of Legislators" compiled. 2. Call their local lines when possible. Write down the numbers or save them as contacts so you don't have to look them up every time. Know that you don't have to be persuasive. You are really just calling to put yourself on a tally that

will be passed along to your representative. You don't have to convince anyone and no one will try to argue with you. Just say your piece (as awkwardly as you want - they won't care!) and get off the phone. Start with an introduction: such as, "Hi my name is and I'm a constitu-

ent of Rep./Sen. calling about a concern I have."

Have a script. This is 100% the best way to keep you focused and calm. There are lots of good scripts you can use or you can write your own. Say what you are

comfortable saying. Remember, you are just calling to be counted.

Most of the time they will just tell you they will pass on your concern. Congratulations if they do this then you are done!

Taxes done yet? If not, it is time to get moving. The witching hour is fast approaching. Start now to get all of your information together. Don't let the April 18th deadline pass you by.

One of the other chores that same of us do along with the spring clean-up schedules is to get physical check-ups. One of the most frequent complaints that patients have is that the doctor doesn't listen to them. If that is a problem for you here are a few recommended strategies to help you get the most of your visit to the doctor. Before you list your concerns begin with a pleasant greeting. After that get to the point. According to Medscape's 2015 "Physician Compensation Report" most doctor visits last 13 to 16 minutes. Be forthright. That is the only way the doctor can help you. Rehearse before you go. Don't wait until the end of the visit to ask questions. Have a list of concerns and ask them within the first few minutes When the doctor is on his way out of the door, he is thinking about the next patient. Last of all let the doctor know what you can afford to pay for prescriptions. Ask the doctor to prescribe an alternative drug for you if you can't afford the one he or she has prescribed.
