Guidelines for Coupon Cutters

Our coupons go to service personnel & their families in non-combat areas overseas. They are redeemable at the PX.

- → Coupons that are expired (up to 6months beyond their redemption date in the US) are still accepted overseas. So save them over the summer & bring them to our October meeting.
- → Coupons should be manufacturer's coupons that are not specific to redemption at a particular store. (No Val~ Publix, Target, etc.)
- → If you are a coupon clipper, please cut the coupons out completely.
- → If you want to go "the extra mile", which would be greatly appreciated, sort the coupons into food & non

-food categories. (pet food coupons should go into the non-food pile.) Label the envelope or bag containing the coupons

"food" or "non-food" so they don't end up getting sorted a second time. , ,

- → Remember to report the time you spend cutting & sorting coupons as community service hours.
- → Our coupons go to the American Legion Auxiliary in Margate where they are tallied for their monetary value & then shipped overseas at no cost to BCREA. Each year they send us a letter of appreciation.
