Author Crosby Keeps BCREA Crowd Awake!


"I've been retired for 987 days and never once have I awakened and said, 'Darn! Wish I could teach school today!'" says author **Bob Crosby**, the speaker at the October meeting of BCREA. This retired educator taught English, coached 38 seasons of athletics, produced 27 year-books and 24 years of school



newspapers. He attributes his silver-gray hair to the yearbooks! A graduate of Stranahan HS and FSU, he spent 33 of his 35 years at Northeast

High School where **Darcy Drago** was his principal for several of those years. "I'd always wanted to be an author," he declares. "I

thought I might be the next 'Agatha Crosby.' But I couldn't even figure out the mysteries I read, let alone come up with a story of my own!" It was around this time that the "Block Plan" was instituted in Broward County. To keep his students from falling asleep during the 90-minute classes, he began to tell stories about his classroom and athletic



experiences. And those stories became his book ***It Happened in School***. His sampling of stories must have impressed the folks at the meeting as he sold at least 35 books!





Then she worked in Adult Education where she taught English to foreign students and Reading to adult non-readers at Deerfield Beach High School.

She has also taught motivational classes in nursing homes in the northern part of Broward County, where she helped the residents to use their thinking and memory skills.
